Applications

Scottish Links consists of four low-growing fine fescues: creeping red fescue, Chewings fescue, hard fescue, and sheep fescue. These fescue species are widely adapted and tolerate shade, low fertility, and reduced irrigation. Scottish Links is ideal for low-maintenance turf in parks, home lawns, golf course roughs, bunker-faces, or roadsides.

Specifications

The 8lbs. (40g) seeding rate will reduce early summer seedhead development when left unmown. For optimum performance and stress tolerance, fertilize no more than 2 lbs. of nitrogen/1,000 ft.2 (10g/m2) per growing season, and not more than 1 lbs. (0.45 kgs) of nitrogen or potash per application.

Maintenance

Seeding rate:

New establishment	4-8lbs./M* (20-40g/m2)
New seeding with rotary or drop seeder:	150-250lbs./acre (170-280kg/ha)
Overseeding with slicer/seeder:	150-200lbs./acre (170-225kg/ha)
